

VOCABULARY NOTES: SCRIPTS 1-9

The verb endings/patterns are probably the most important thing we have learned over Scripts 1-9:

For the regular verbs of the following types, you should be able to produce 1 sg., 2 sg., 3 sg., 3 pl., and infinitive forms.

➔ Practice by using them in sentences with your nouns and pronouns, with *χρή* (“it is necessary...”), etc.

Also commands for uncontracted verbs like *ἐθέλω* (singular *-ε*, plural *-ετε*, for ex. *λέγε, χαῖρε, χαίρετε*).

Also the “let’s” form for verbs like *ἐθέλω* (for ex. *ἀναγιγνώσκωμεν*).

Also the singular commands *δείκνυ* and *δός*.

Also the 1-3 sg. past forms *ἔλαβον/ἔμαθον* etc., and the “once” infinitive of these two verbs (**pattern on p. 13**).

-ω verbs with 1 sg. in -ω:
(patterns on pp. 22-23)

uncontracted: *ἐθέλω*, etc., etc.

-έω verbs: *φιλέω*, etc.

-άω verbs: *ὀράω, ἔρωτάω*

-ω verbs with 1 sg. in -ομαι:
(patterns on p. 22)

uncontracted: *βούλομαι, ἔρχομαι*

-έομαι verb: *φοβέομαι*

-μι verbs:
(pattern on p. 25)

δείκνυμι, δίδωμι

Also a few forms from verbs in *-μαι* (these are related to *-μι* forms as *-ομαι* forms are related to *-ω* forms):

κεῖμαι “I lie”

κεῖται “he/she lies”

κεῖσθαι (infin.)

ἀνίσταμαι “I am standing up”

ἀνίσταται “he/she is standing up”

ἀνίστασθε “stand up!” (plural command)

ἀνίστασθαι (infin.)

irregular verbs (only these forms):

1 sg. *εἰμι* “I am”

2 sg. *εἶ*

3 sg. *ἐστί(ν)*

3 pl. *εἰσι(ν)*

εἶμι “I will go”

εἶ

εἴσι(ν)

οἶδα “I know”

οἶσθα

οἶδε(ν)

For every other word on p. 25, be able to understand its meaning & use it in sentences copied or modeled directly after the ones in Scripts 1-9.
